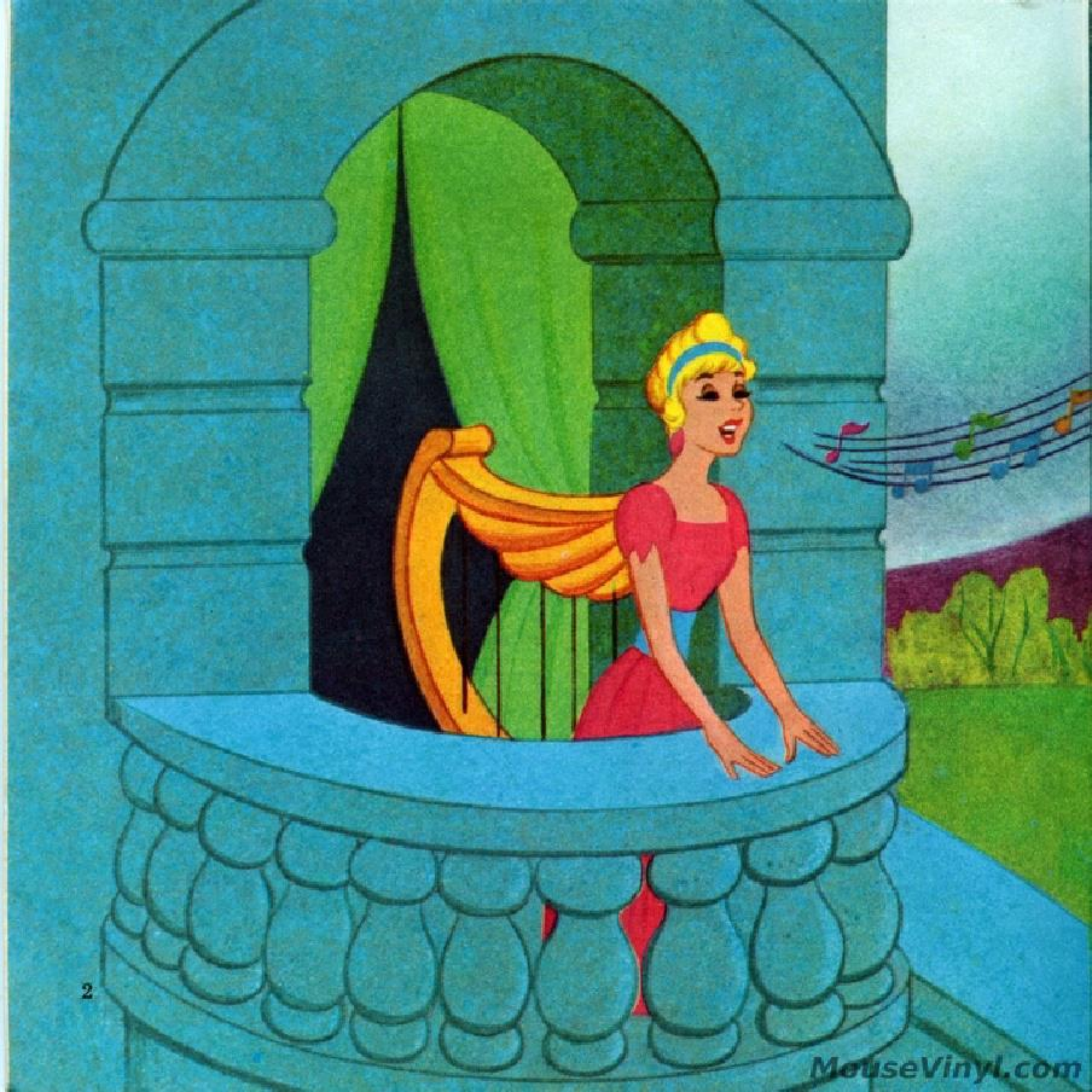

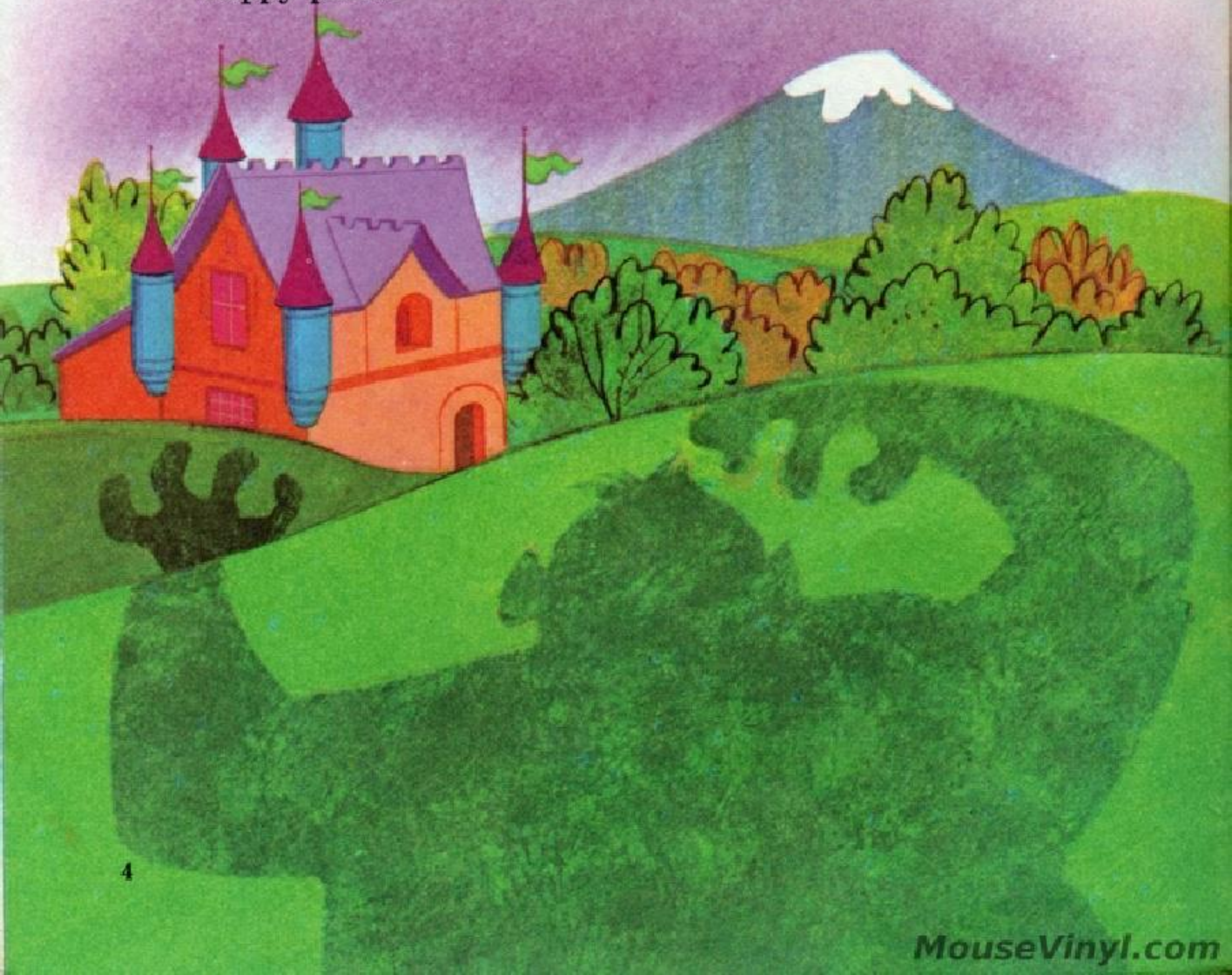

Mickey, however, exchanged the cow for some magic beans and brought them home to Donald and Goofy.



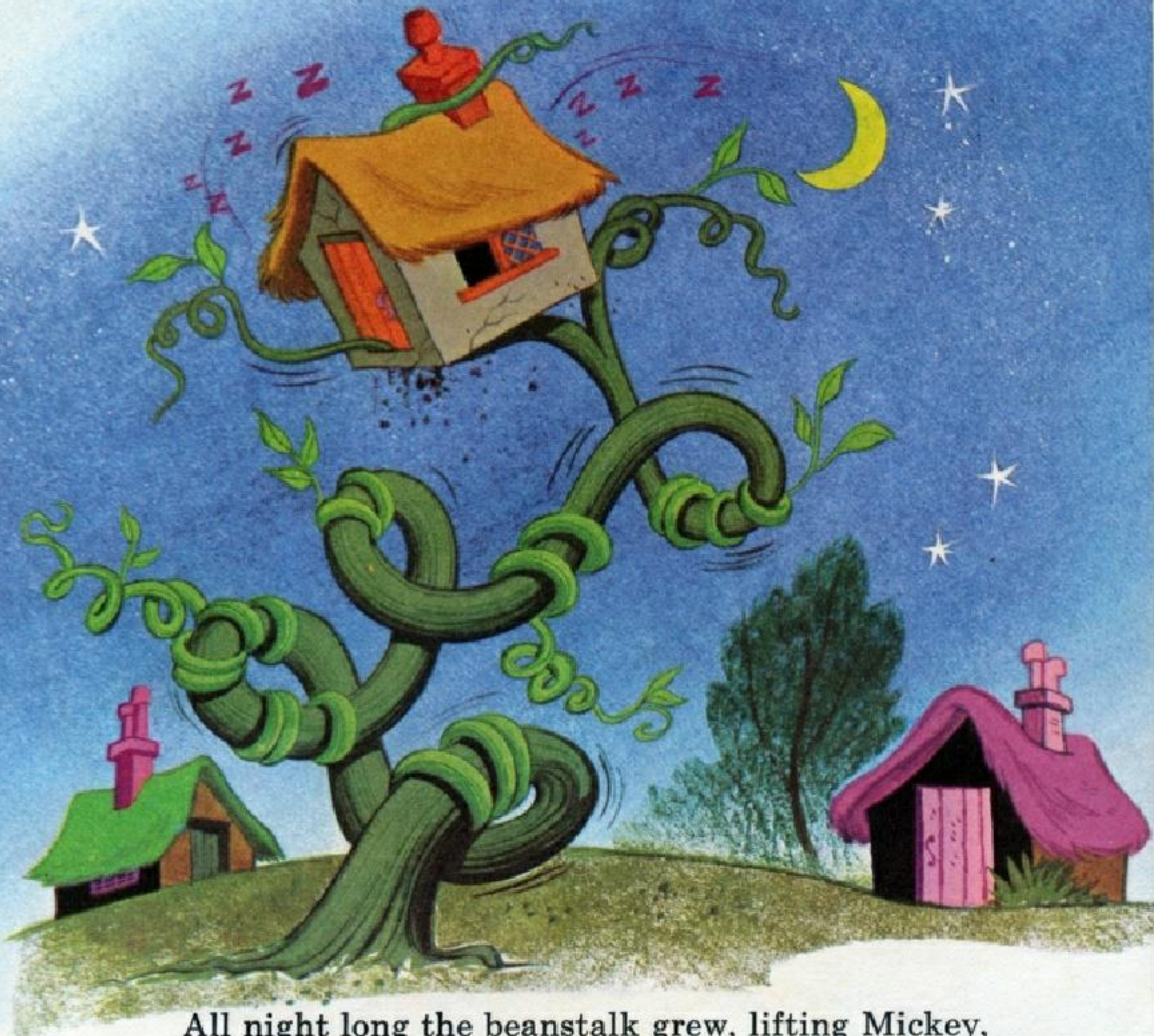




Donald became so angry he threw the beans across the room and one bean fell through a crack in the floor.

When they woke up in the morning, they were in a land above the clouds. Directly in front of them stood a giant castle.

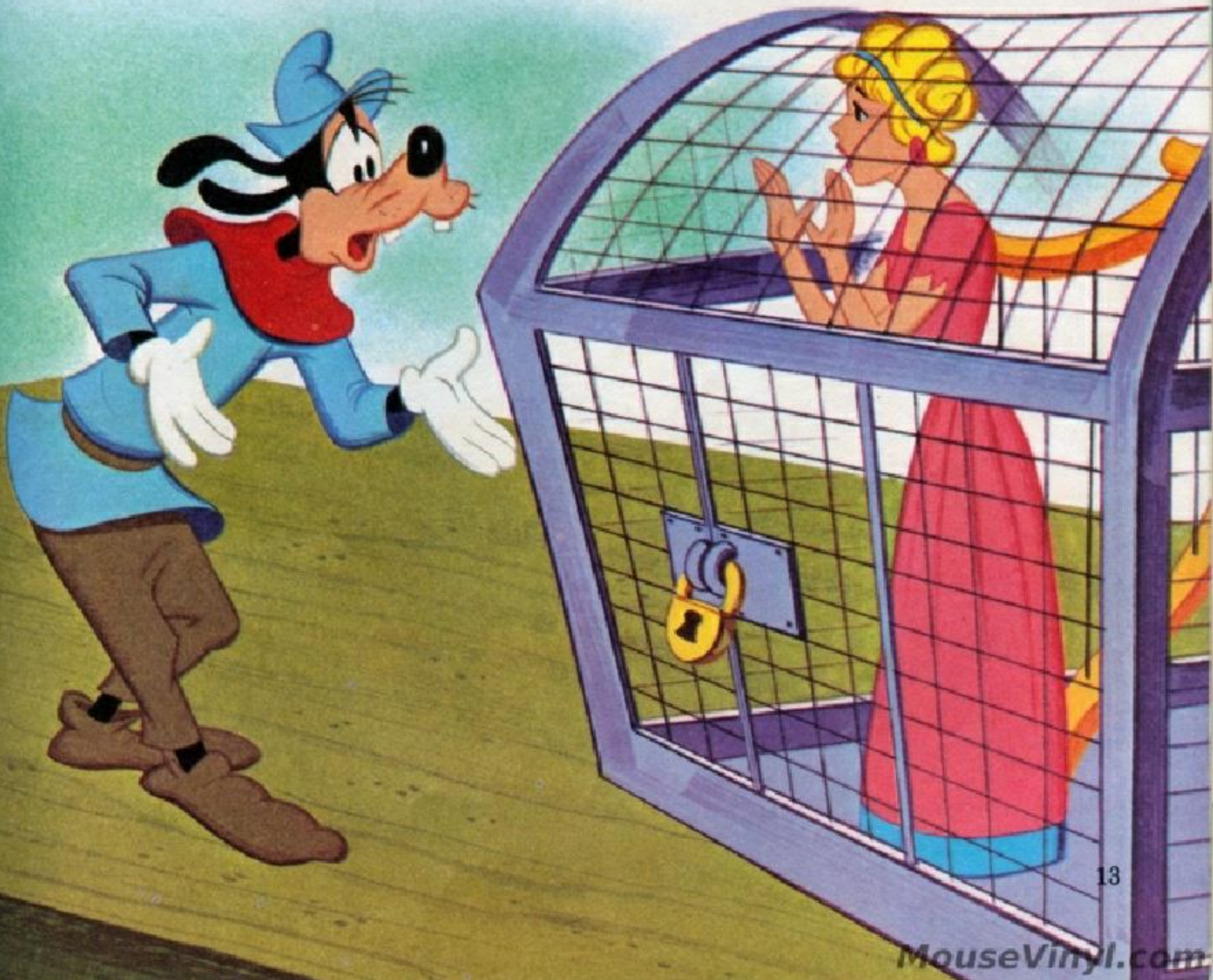
They knocked on the massive door but no one answered, so they crawled under and found themselves in a grand hall.

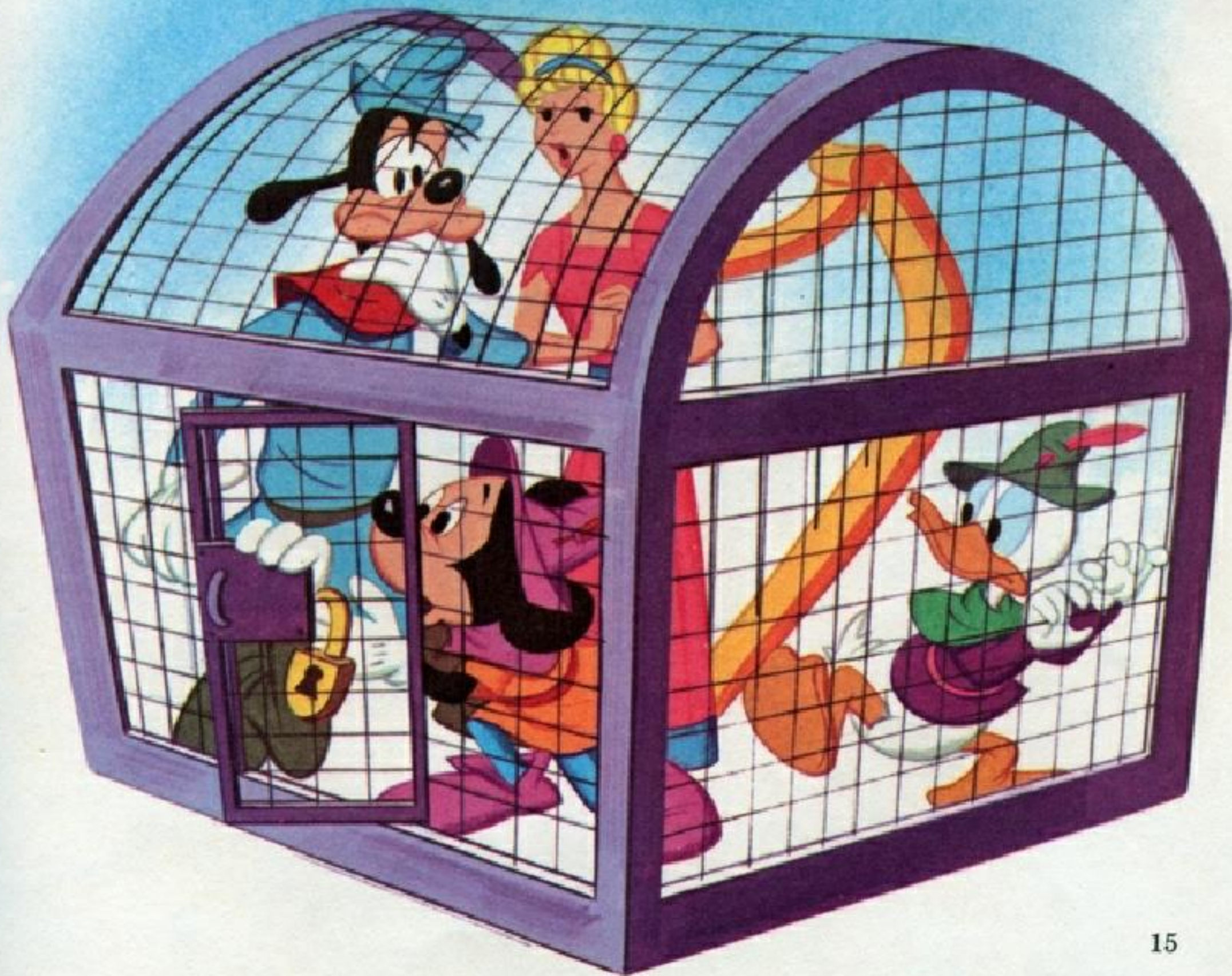




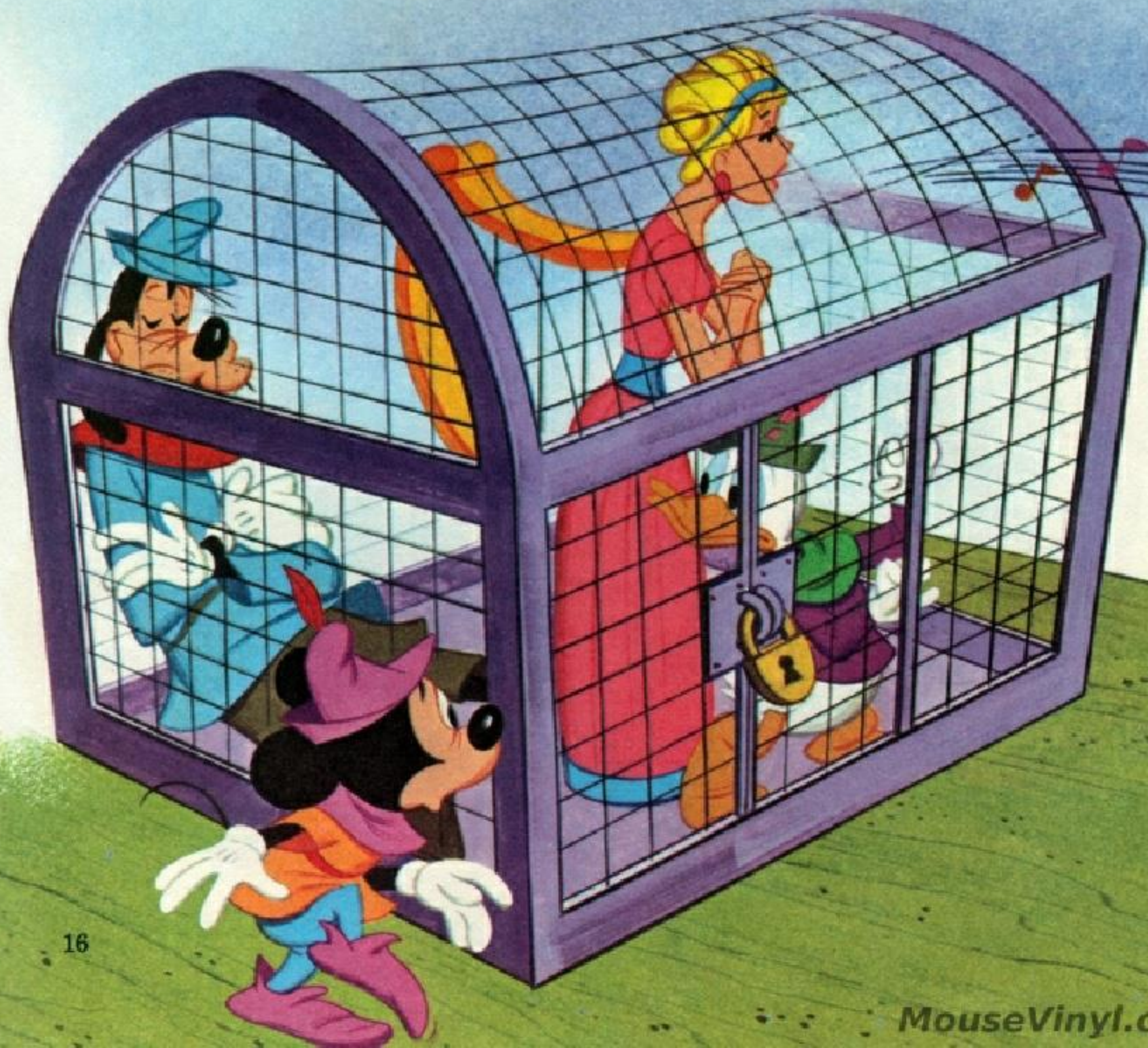
Mickey, Donald and Goofy hid behind some dishes on the table.
