“I need to think.”



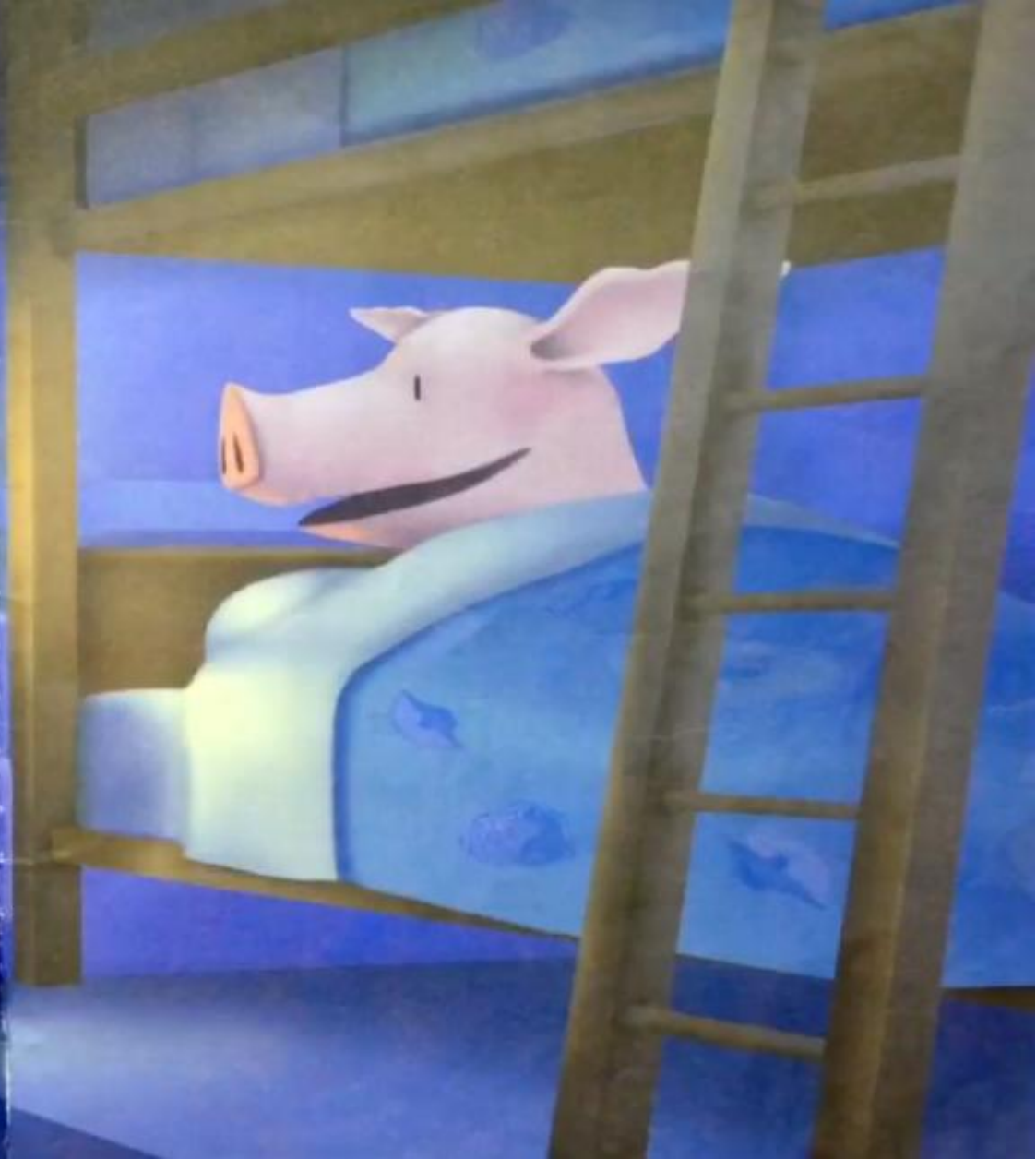
“Of course! Fireflies!”
